## Albany Rotary Sets Up Program For Lifeguard Medic Bracelets

"Project Lifeguard," a community service project of the Albany Rotary Club and the Albany Life Underwriters, has distributed more than 45,000 applications for Medic Alert bracelets.

A booth was set up at the Albany Home Show where more than 3,000 applications were handed out. Lifeguard's office has received many calls for additional supplies from banks, drug stores, hospitals and doctors' offices who are cooperating with this project by placing canisters on display.

The project's speakers bureau has made more than a dozen

talks to fire departments, rescue squads, hospitals and to Albany Boys Academy, Milne School and most of the area service clubs.
